Rev Kay Hunter a great light in this world, and also spoke words directly from Jeshua’s heart in her ministry in Dallas, Texas where she founded the Cathedral of Light. And she was a true friend of Oakbridge University and all of the Heart Family. She and her COL family joined a very special Christos Advance in Colorado in 2008 and it was a love fest! So it is wonderful to read her powerful introduction to this book.

Her heartfelt message was usually about the core of our Divinity as being Love, Peace and Joy. She shared her personal experiences and learnings as examples of Spirit’s work. Her words could have been written yesterday about the state of the world in which we find ourselves “With the world in a state of chaos, anger and fear, what changes do we need in order to make a difference? If all is a reflection of something within, we need to look deeper than the mind and the opinions of other to the heart. See as God sees. Great healing energies are embracing your planet. Use them wisely and lovingly.”

In her humble and charming way, Rev. Kay saw the Christ in everyone and every situation. She channeled Jeshua as well and shared them as messages. She wrote down these messages and they were compiled into a book Children of the Light by her friends.

Here is an excerpt from the book for June 12th “Know the power of your imagination. It is a gift I have given you. Use it to create. Use it wisely and use it well. As I have imaged you in my likeness, you have used that universal power to image yourself into form. Life is beautiful, for it is Love in its infinite understanding. If you see life through distorted images, you see it not at all. Imagination is the gift of the ages. If you can see it and know it, you can truly believe it into being. Your inner desires, coupled with your creative vision, gives form to that which you image - and then it is so.”

- If you ever met Rev Kay or were part of the congregation of the Cathedral of Light, what is your favorite memory of her or her work?

Affirmation for the Week:

Assignment

1. Practice the suggestion that Rev. Kay offers us in “When you pray for an answer, wait for the Voice to speak.” Give yourself enough time when you have said an affirmative prayer (no begging) to listen for the answer with an open heart and mind. Write it down afterwards and resolve to follow the answer that you receive. Give yourself a chance to see the situation from God’s point of view. Trust God enough to follow the advice of the Voice.
2. Use the following affirmation inspired by Rev Kay for at least a week “For today I see myself as perfect, whole and complete.” Note the stirrings in your heart when you affirm that Truth about yourself. Extend this vision to others as well. Which is easier to do? Be the Beholder in this experiment in “Seeing as God sees us”.
