
Chapter 16 Cross Culture Multiculturalism

Introduction

This chapter flows out of the previous one as a follow-up to our purpose on this planet, at this time. We have chosen, as masters, to be part of this experiment on this planet of creating harmony among diverse cultures “from various star constellations, even other realities” and “evolve into an awareness of Oneness”.

Jeshua gives us some very common sense guidelines for learning to understand and even appreciate each other. Listening and respectfully asking questions of others’ beliefs also helps us to define our beliefs more clearly. Standing up for one another when there is unfairness.

Jeshua, the social activist, comes out strongly for speaking up on behalf of those who are being abused and standing up to those who are abusing their power. If we dare to act courageously, we will be hastening “the evolution of heaven on Earth”. Respect plays a big part in this evolution. “It does not matter what the physical body looks like. What matters is the spirit, the motivating force.”

The power principles of “Cross Culture Multiculturalism” are:

- **Get to know people in your community across all cultures and beliefs. Relate to others as friend to friend.**
- **Speak and listen for understanding when questioning their beliefs and clarifying yours.**
- **Take appropriate action when you see injustice happening.**
- **Learn another language so you can gain greater understanding of those who speak that language.**
- **Encourage children to learn other languages.**

Discussion Questions

- What passage in this chapter touches your heart? Your mind? Your imagination?

- Have you ever been the one who is excluded from a group? Have you ever excluded someone else or pre-judged them, without getting to know them? Think about how you might do things differently. What beliefs led to your actions or inaction?
- Have you ever stood up for someone who was being abused or for your own identity? What led you to do that? What were the consequences for you or the other person? This could also apply to standing up for our Mother Earth, the environment, animals or groups of people?

Assignments

- Jeshua gives us an assignment to welcome diverse interactions “When you meet ones who are of a different perspective, allow yourself to have a discourse with them as to what their belief is, what their traditions are. Why do they believe as they do? Your questioning will help them question why they hold certain beliefs. And the questioning about their beliefs will then allow them to question certain actions, because all actions come out of belief.” Journal about it.
- “Purchase for yourself a set of language tapes in this next week and then begin to understand the culture and traditions from which that language has sprung.” Perhaps you have language skills, and have been a translator. Recall what that has felt like and how you can use your understanding to create bridges between people. Share with someone about it.
- “Develop your sense of intuition. Even if you do not understand what the words mean (that another is saying) tune in to your intuition, that inner knowing what they may be talking about, what they are saying, what they may be feeling.” Everyone has a nonverbal language which is universal, so tune into that and see if your services are required.
