## Introduction

These last three chapters were bonus material of Parables that Jeshua offered us in conjunction with other messages. They form a trilogy of the kind of stories that he told to illustrate the powerful principles and ideas that he was trying to get across, especially to people who did not necessarily have access to written material. Plus, they were easier to remember and relate to. “Oftentimes two thousand years ago I would sit with you and I would tell very simple stories. Very little was written down in those days.”

### The power principles of “The Parables”:

- **Parable of the Camel Trader principles –**
  - Count your blessings – everything that is “important to you is right here.” Appreciate your abundance in all areas of your life.
  - You are greatly loved. Jeshua is always with us.
- **Parable of the Widow**
  - Everything can be taken from you except for the love that you have experienced.
  - “Count yourself blessed by every moment of love, for truly that is where your treasure lies.”
- **Parable of the Princess in the Castle**
  - “One being experiencing itself as two, and then three.” Complex concept of how Oneness – “all from the same source” can be experienced as the many.
  - Divine Feminine has been kept guarded in the castle and now is the time for these “qualities of intuitive gentleness, the knowing that goes beyond just the physical” to be welcomed into the world.
  - Divine Feminine intuition can “help you make an expanded understanding of the divinity even of the world as the world yet sees itself to be quite chaotic.”

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## Discussion Questions

- What passage in this chapter touches your heart? Your mind? Your imagination?
- Which of these parables resonated with you the most? Which of the messages have you seen played out in your own life or the lives of those around you in your family or the wider world?
- In the Parable of the Princess in the Castle, Jeshua refers to one of the Divine Feminine qualities as the ability to “move forward in time. You can move in the inner realm to what you would see a future to be.” Have you ever called on your feminine energy to intuitively project yourself into the future? Have you ever found yourself seeing the inevitable outcomes of a situation that others seem oblivious to? How did you know what others did not? Do you have an example?

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## Assignments

- **Write your own Parable** based on one of the principles discussed in these three chapters. (Gratitude, Love, Immortality, Divine Feminine) Or perhaps you have gained another profound realization from another part of this book that you can make into a parable type story – with a good “moral” ending. You can change the names and places “to protect the innocent” and it does not have to follow an exact sequence of events as it did in your life. Ask yourself: What was it that the protagonist did not understand about something in their lives? What made the main character shift their perspective? What is the universal experience that others can identify with? Try your hand at writing it down in the format that Jeshua did with his stories.
- **In a paragraph** (or more) what is the most important learning that you are taking from this book as a whole. Be prepared to share with the group.
